The Nightingale's Despair. Music and Moral Being in Greater Central Asia



Questions of music's relation to the moral being of those who make and hear it, have occupied the minds of philosophers, theologians, bards and ordinary listeners since classical antiquity. The *Nightingale's Despair* will ponder these questions in light of the lives, the poetry and the music of bards and drummers of Tajikistan, Pakistan and India. The book is based on approximately 8 years of fieldwork in these countries and draws on Wolf's knowledge of the Persian, Tajik, Urdu, Tamil, Kotha and Wakhil languages.
