

Unique chance: Spend your mobility term at one of India's best Universities!

Heidelberg University has just finalised an Agreement for a Graduate Student Exchange Programme with the University of Hyderabad – one of the most prestigious central universities in India. The agreement, which comes into immediate effect, allows three students per academic year - from the Masters Programme in Transcultural Studies or South Asian Studies - to spend a semester in Hyderabad. Courses can be chosen from any syllabus from within the faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences and the Sarojini Naidu School of Arts & Communication, Performance and Music. A successful application at the HCTS' Graduate Programme Office will provide a waiver of tuition fees and free housing at the Tagore International House (lodging and food). We are happy to advise on how to secure further funding, e.g., to cover travel costs to India. The successful applicant will study for the spring term (January-April) and courses completed successfully will be fully credited. The disciplines at the University of Hyderabad that fall within the Agreement range from Art History to Fine Arts and Performance/Communication Studies to History, Sociology, Regional Studies and Anthropology. Hyderabad has an exceptional and engaged faculty, a beautiful campus with top student facilities. The huge campus is well-connected with the old and new cities of Hyderabad, whereas Hyderabad itself is well-connected to other cities in India.

If you want to spend the upcoming third term (January-April 2015) in Hyderabad, please apply, with an up-to-date transcript of records and a letter of motivation, outlining what and at which centre/department/school you envisage to take courses, as soon as possible, at the latest, by October 30th, 2014.
