The establishment of Bangladesh as a nation-state in 1971 through a War of Liberation was the fulfilment of Bangabandhu's long dream of a separate state for the Bengalis. However, beyond this, the founding Father of the Bengali nation had distinct thoughts and ideals covering society, economics, politics, humanity, global peace, etc. and a vision of what the Bangladesh state would look like in future. The lecture will dwell on all these points.
