Violence and Extraction: Caste and the Welfare Regime in Postcolonial Tamilnadu 1950s-80s

The scholarship on politics in postcolonial Tamil Nadu is overwhelmingly in agreement that the state represents a laudable "exception" in the Indian subcontinent, an example of the electoral supplanting of traditional elite castes by the plebs, genuine democratization and the emergence of an anti-caste, secular public culture. Identifying series of interrelated methodological limitations and theoretical missteps in this literature, this paper proposes an alternative account of postcolonial political settlement in Tamil Nadu. It depends on a wealth of archival data on the governance of anti-Dalit violence in the state and the implementation of its caste-differentiated welfare regime—sources the earlier literature entirely ignores—as well as a theoretical framework that explains how the postcolonial state's regulation of land and labor sustains that violence.
