The South Asia Institute was founded in 1962 as an interdisciplinary centre for research and teaching on South Asia. It deals with the countries Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, the Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. The South Asia Institute combines - for the first time and uniquely in Germany - social and economic sciences and geosciences with historically and philologically oriented cultural studies.

Two PhD positions have been funded by the DFG to research the importance of anticolonial sonic mobilization in British India, specifically focusing on the role of songs and slogans. The timeframe for the project is the interwar period, particularly the early 1930s.

Profile:

- Candidates should have above-average grades in a university degree (master or equivalent), with a major in modern South Asian history
- Excellent communication skills, including writing, in English and in at least one South Asian language is essential, as the project will draw extensively on vernacular materials
- Advanced skills in historical methodology and theoretical knowledge of sound studies, and some archival experience, preferably in South Asia, is an advantage
- As doctoral student, you are expected to write a dissertation in an area related to the research interests of the DFG research project, "A Sonic Approach to Anti-Colonialism in British India"
- Engage in the History Department's various activities, potentially also mentoring and tutoring Masters and Bachelors students (up to 3 hours per week during term times, approximately 28 weeks per year)

- A set budget to support archival access

- An interdisciplinary research environment
- Access to one of the finest South Asian library collections in Europe, in the CATS Library
- Training in multisensory historical methodology as necessary
